In the past four years, Mr. McFerrin has managed UXO clearance, munitions destruction, management projects and more than \$600 million in vertical construction, debris removal and municipal waste as a Site Manager, Program Manager and now Program Director for the Air Force Center for Engineering and the Environment, ECCI International in Iraq. He is directly responsible for more than 20 Task Orders under the AFCEE program for Iraqi Army military bases and Iraqi Police Stations throughout Iraq. Directing the efforts of 2,600 Americans, third country nationals and Iraqi Nationals, Mr. McFerrin is responsible for the life-cycle management of projects – from the proposal strategy phase, to award, mobilization, design/build, turnover and warranty period – and currently is responsible for more than \$355 million in construction projects, including power, water, and septic infrastructure, as well as road systems and buildings. In seven months his programs have won an additional \$210 million in work in the toughest regions in Iraq.



Mr. McFerrin served as the Program Manager for two Task Orders in support of the ECC's New Orleans Debris Removal contract with US Army Corps of Engineers, as well as the initial Operations Director. His operational knowledge was instrumental in quickly mobilizing and structuring the organization for success in the dynamic environment of post-Katrina New Orleans.

During his tenure with the Marine Corps Systems Command, Mr. McFerrin served as Munitions Operations Officer, Director of the Marine Corps Explosive Safety Office, and Director of the Environmental and Explosive Safety Division. He brings 24 years of experience as a US Marine with documented success in demanding environments in all faces of munitions logistics, public relations, and recruiting. He has related experience in counterterrorism and counterintelligence fields with the US Marines and the US State Department.
